Subject: Zoning By-Law Amendment and Shore Road Allowance Applications – 714 B Line

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the report from the Clerk Administrator regarding the applications for zoning by-law amendment and shore road allowance purchase for the property located at 714 B Line Road be received, and,

That staff be authorized to initiate the public notification process for the proposed zoning by-law amendment and sale of shore road allowance.

Applications have been received for a Zoning By-Law Amendment and Shore Road Allowance purchase for the property located at 714 B Line Road.

### **Background information**

- Applications were received simultaneously as they are dependent of each other's passing.
- The applicants would like to construct an addition (900 sq. ft.) to the existing cottage.
- Current building footprint 832 sq. ft.
- Septic holding tanks are located behind the existing cottage and won't allow construction behind the existing footprint. The foundation of the existing structure will not support additional storeys.
- A copy of the draft survey as well as a map showing the location of the property have been attached for reference.
- If both the zoning by-law amendment and shore road allowance purchase are approved, the applications would plan construction to start as soon as possible.

### **Zoning By-Law Amendment**

- The zoning by-law permits an increase of 30% of the existing footprint without an amendment for legal non-conforming structures.
- The requested % increase would be approximately 108% increasing the overall footprint from 832 sq. ft. to 1732 sq. ft.
- The amendment would not reduce the setback to the high water mark any further. The closest point of setback is currently 43 feet. (Setback is 100 ft.)

### Shore Road Allowance (SRA)

- Applicants do not currently own the SRA, however existing cottage is located partially on it.
- Must purchase the SRA for a building permit to be issued for construction/alteration.
- 145' feet of frontage would be purchased totalling an estimated cost of \$5,263.50 to the applicants.

BY-LAW 2022-15
