## Garden Membership

The St. Joseph Island Community Garden offers individual 4'  $\times$  8' garden beds. Waistheight beds are also available for those with mobility or back issues.

Beds can be rented annually for a nominal fee of \$20/season. Rental fees provide members with access to tools, storage, water, power and gardening



assistance and are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.

We practice organic gardening; and garden without synthetic pesticides, fertilizers or any harmful chemicals. We focus on building healthy soil and learn to garden in harmony with the environment.

As part of the membership requirements, members are required to complete a total of 6 hours of volunteer service at various work bees and social events, which are held monthly during the garden season (April – October.)

## Garden Rules

- 1. Turn off the fence and Motion-Activated Sprinkler when you enter; and turn them back on when you leave. The deer love the garden and will eat everything if they get the chance!
- 2. You must agree to be committed to the use of organic gardening practices as required by Ontario law. All chemical herbicides, insecticides and fertilizers such as Miracle-Gro are banned from use in the garden.
- 3. Each member must work one hour per month of volunteer time outside of working on their own plot. This might include spreading mulch, preparing beds, planting or picking the Food Bank beds, attend committee meetings, etc.
- 4. Each member must attend at least one community event such as the spring planting event.
- 5. Keep a record of your volunteer hours in the shed.
- 6. Respect other gardeners and don't pick out of their bed unless you have permission.
- 7. Garden tools are available for use. Please return them to the shed and use the communication book to identify any broken tools.
- 8. Please respect the deadlines for planting your plot in the spring and cleaning up your garden in the fall.
- 9. Use the communication log for sharing information. Notify a committee member if you are experiencing any problems.
- 10. If you do not follow the rules you will not be guaranteed a plot in future.
